JOHN KEATS (1795-1821)



- John Keats is an English Romantic poet. He was one of the main influential figures of the second generation of Romantic poet who blossomed dearly and died young.
- He is best known as 'bright star'.
 Many attacked him for self-indulgence and indelicate sentimentalities but he was no doubt greatest poet of all time.
- He has overcome all the torments of life and resigned to the contemplation of beauty without any disturbing thoughts.
- Keats died at the age of twenty-five and it is amazing that he was able to produce many kinds of reflective works so young.

- Life, death, love

TITLE
