## SHORT HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

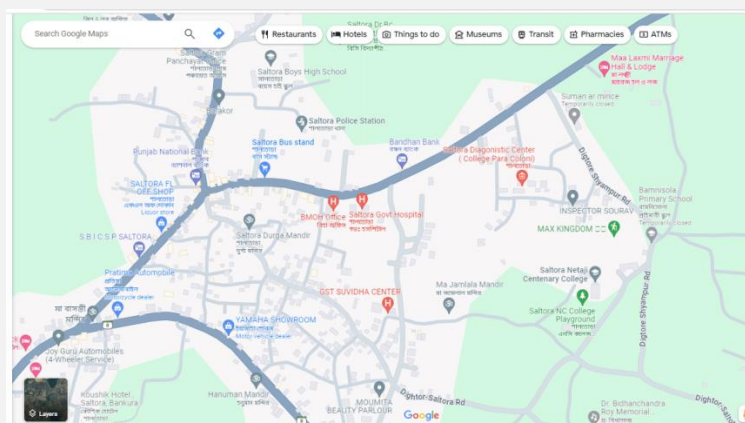
The people of Saltora and adjoining blocks acutely felt the need of a Degree College at Saltora for a long time. As a step to that direction, a public meeting was convened in **1997** by a group of people which encouraged the organizers to proceed further for the establishment of a degree college. People from every walk of life promised all kinds of possible help. An organizing committee was constituted. It was decided that the proposed degree college be named as “**SALTORA NETAJI CENTENARY COLLEGE**” to show reverence and respect to our great national hero, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose on his auspicious birth centenary. Land, money and material came in the form of donation.

The University of Burdwan granted affiliation and recognition to this co-educational institution from the session 2000–2001. The College started its journey with 58 students. At the very outset of the College, classes were held at Saltora **Dr. B.C.Vidyapith**. Thereafter college building was constructed and classes were shifted from Dr. B.C Vidyapith to the new campus in the month of May, 2001. The college is currently affiliated to the Bankura University from the session, 2017-2018. The college is recognized **under Section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act,1956**.

The college is affiliated to the Bankura University and all of its activities will be conducted as per rules and regulations framed by the university from time to time and by the order of the Education Directorate, Govt. of West Bengal

## LOCATION

The College is located in the lap of nature being surrounded with green hills, near Saltora –Mejia Road, 1.5 K.M. away from the Saltora Bazaar, not so far from the hills of Biharinath and Susunia.



## Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme (CCFUP):

1. New Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme, UGC 2022 (as per NEP 2020) for 4-years undergraduate programme(s) with “UG Degree Programmes with Single Major” only will be maintained for the academic session 2024-2025.



2. As per New Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme, UGC 2022 (as per NEP 2020), the Undergraduate degree programmes of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as :

i. a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided that a vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 40 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.

ii. a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study provided that a vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 82 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.

iii. a bachelor's degree after a 3-year (6 semesters) programme of study,

iv. a 4-year bachelor's degree (Honours) after a 4-year (8 semesters) programme of study. If the student completes a rigorous research project in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then (Honours with Research).

### **Eligibility for the UG Programmes:**

The eligibility here is maintained for the credit structure for UG Degree Programme with Single Major only (attached herewith).

#### **1st Year**

**Entry 1:-** Entry requirement for 1st year 1st semester is successful completion of 10+2/ Higher Secondary (12th Grade) or equivalent stage of education from any recognized Board/Council/University.

**Exit 1:-** Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

#### **2nd Year**

**Entry 2:-**Entry requirement is a UG Certificate obtained after completing the 1st year (Two Semesters) of the UG Programme.

**Exit 2:-** Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 82 credits will be awarded the UG Diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

#### **3rd Year**

**Entry 3:-**Entry requirement is a UG Diploma obtained after successful completion of two years (Four semesters) of the UG Programme.

**Exit 3:-** Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 124 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as per the credit structure.

#### **4th Year**



**Entry 4:-**An individual seeking admission to a Bachelor's degree (Honors/ Honours with Research) in a specified field of learning would normally have completed all requirements of the relevant Three-year Bachelor's Degree.

Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project/dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline.

**Exit 4:-**

**4-year UG Degree (Honours):** A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 164 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as per the credit structure.

**4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research):** Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project/dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students who secure 164credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

**N.B.**

i. The duration of the UG programme is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. If a student wants to leave after the completion of the first or second year, the student will be given a UG Certificate or UG Diploma, respectively, provided they secure the prescribed number of credits (as per the credit structure). Students who exit with a UG certificate or UG diploma are permitted to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme.

ii. Students may be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study but the total duration for completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.

#### **Additional rules regarding Centralised Online admission-2024-25**

1. Rules regarding **Centralised Online Admission** to undergraduate courses in 1st Semester for academic session - 2024-25 as laid down by the Department of Higher Education, West Bengal State Govt.(notification vide No.- 375-Edn(CS)/10M-95/14, dated 19<sup>th</sup> June 2024) will be strictly followed for online admission.

- The Portal aims to provide opportunities to the students, to choose their desired course in the desired colleges via a single window platform and also to stop admission in multiple times by a single student at various colleges/ Universities so that maximum number of seats can be filled up in all Colleges/ Universities.
- An Indian student can apply online through the following websites - <https://banglaruchchashiksha.wb.gov.in>, <https://wbsche.wb.gov.in> by clicking the "Centralised Admission" button or directly to <https://wbcap.in/>. There is no Fee for Application.



- Any Indian student who has qualified (10+2) or equivalent examination from any recognized Board/Council/Equivalent body within the country, can apply for admission to the Undergraduate courses.
- An applicant can apply for a maximum of 25 programmes/courses in one or multiple Higher Educational Institutions across the State. An applicant can create a Preference List, Institution-wise and course-wise.
- Students can take help of the 'Bangla Sahayata Kendras for filling up their application form FREE OF COST, if needed. User Manual and Tutorials have been provided in the Portal for step by step guidance to the students.

### Modalities:

- Online Admission Process should be done strictly based on merit. Prospective students should not be called for counselling or verification of documents during the process of admission. No physical presence will be required at the Higher Education Institutions.
- **Based on higher preference and on the availability of seats, an applicant will be allotted a single seat only.**
- No charges shall be taken from students for scanning/ uploading of documents through the Centralised Admission Portal through Bangla Sahayata Kendras'.
- Eligible Applicants will be notified directly through Portal through SMS and E-mail at each step. The applicant will also able to see individual status through student's own dashboard.
- **Payment of fees for admission shall be done only through this Portal.**
- **An applicant will have the scope of upgrading his/her preference even after taking admission.**
- **An applicant will have to pay the Admission Fee initially. In case of upgradation, only the additional fee, if any, will have to be paid. However, the candidate needs to cancel the previous admission for upgradation. If the Admission Fee in the new Course/Programme is lesser, his/her balance fee will be refunded after the completion of the entire admission process.**
- All Stakeholders shall adhere to the guidelines of COVID-19, issued by the Government from time to time.
- This is issued with the approval of competent authority and will remain in effect until further order.

### Session Gap :

For admission to the Under Graduate Course (1st year, 1st semester), there should not be a gap of more than 3 years between the year of Higher Secondary/10+2 or equivalent Examination and the year of admission to Under Graduate Programme of study **i.e 2022, 2023 and 2024**. In respect of calculation of marks, no deduction should be made in case of candidates passing out in previous years.

### **Percentage of Attendance**

Student reading in degree classes must have 75% percentage of attendance in order to appear at examinations as per the Bankura University guidelines.

### **Anti Ragging Policy of our Institution**

According to the UGC Regulations (No: UGC-Rag/C/96/15/SCHE/2009) circulated on April 13.2009) ragging in our Institution is strictly prohibited and totally banned, and anyone found guilty of ragging is liable to be punished in any one or more than one way mentioned below:

- a) Cancellation of admission
- b) Suspension from attending classes
- c) Withholding/Withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
- d) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
- e) Withholding results
- f) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- g) Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters
- h) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution
- i) Fine of Rs. 25,000/-
- j) Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggars.

### **The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)**

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) has been constituted in the college under Section-3 of UGC act-1956 for prevention, prohibition, and redressal of the sexual harassment of women at the workplace. ICC meets on a need basis to address any complaints from students, teaching and nonteaching members and takes necessary action. The College has a zero-tolerance policy towards any such transgression. The college is committed to providing a safe and conducive work and academic environment to students and its employees and is extremely alert to matters pertaining to any kind of harassment and gender sensitivity.

### **Women's Cell**

The college takes all necessary steps to implement the UGC guidelines regarding anti-ragging such as submission of affidavit by the student and guardian on anti-ragging at the time of admission, installation of CCTV cameras at vital points and a clear mention of





anti-ragging warning in the institution's prospectus and information booklets /brochures. The college has both online and offline mechanism for submission of students' grievances. There is an online portal for students' grievances where they can submit their grievance which is then taken up for consideration by the respective committee. Students can also register their grievances offline by submitting written applications stating the nature of their grievance. Appropriate action is then taken against the submitted application.
